# FAMILY LEARNING TIME

This home support reinforces the importance of learning and offers a time to explore the faith.

## **REQUIREMENTS**

- There is a fee of \$25 for each Sacrament program totaling \$50.
- This amount helps us to offset the cost of resources.
- All are welcome, and support is available if this is a concern.
- Participation at the Sessions is necessary to prepare the parents and the children who will receive the Sacraments.
- Consistent Diocesan wide program offers a variety of opportunities to attend the same Session at another parish.
- If your child has not yet been baptized or has been baptized in another faith tradition, please contact the parish office at your earliest convenience.
