There was a church where the pastor and the minister of music were not getting along. As time went by, this began to spill over into the worship service.


The first week the pastor preached on commitment and how we all should dedicate ourselves to the service of God. The music director led the song, "I Shall Not Be Moved."

#### 14 of September Exaltation of the Holy Cross - Feast

The cross is a sign of Christ's Victory over Satan and death. In Jerusalem, from the fifth century, the cross was venerated on the day following the anniversary of the dedication of the Church of the Resurrection, that is, on September 14. From this custom arose a separate feast, which spread throughout the Church.

When Jerusalem was conquered and destroyed by the Romans in 70 BC., Christian experience a great persecution, lasting nearly 300 years. Only after the end of these persecutions, the mother of the Roman Emperor Constantine, St. Helena, order to look for the Cross on which the Lord Jesus died. After a long search, the Cross was found. Historians

disagree on the date of this event; The year 320, 326 or 330 is most often given, while all sources give September 13 or 14 as the day. In connection with this event, two basilicas were built in Jerusalem on Golgotha: the Martyrs (Martyrium) and the Resurrection (Anastasis). The Basilica of the Martyrs was also called the

Basilica of the Cross. On September 13, 335, a solemn consecration and handover to the local bishop of both basilicas took place. To commemorate this, the Solemnity of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross was celebrated every year on 13 September. Later, this feast was moved to September 14, because this day is the anniversary of exposing the relics of the Cross to public view, i.e. the first adoration of the Cross, which took place the day after the dedication of the basilicas. The feast was introduced first for those churches that had relics of the Cross, and then for the whole Universal Church.

The Feast of the Exaltation of Christ's Cross invites us to reflect on the mystery hidden in the Cross of the Saviour. We make the sign of the cross in many circumstances of our spiritual life. With this sign we begin and end our prayers. We also do it at the beginning and at the end of Mass. Let us not forget it as we begin our journey. Let us always try to make the holy sign of the cross carefully and respectfully, because it is a sign of our salvation. It reminds us that we were redeemed by Jesus' death on the Cross. On the wood of the Cross the greatest work of love was accomplished, the salvation of everyone, without exception, of man. The sight of the Cross is close to us. We have been brought up in respect for the cross. We see it first in our homes, churches, and many, many other places. We also wear it on our chests.

Let us now turn our thoughts to the old days. Over two thousand years ago, people associated the Cross with great suffering, it was a symbol of the greatest shame and humiliation of man. Christ the Lord, although He did not commit any sin, voluntarily agreed to die on the cross in order to apologize to God the Father on behalf of all people for the sins of the whole world. God accepted His Son's atonement and forgave us. By his resurrection, Jesus showed that he is the true God and is stronger than sin, stronger than death and suffering. That is why we surround the sign of the cross with so much respect and love. Before the cross we kneel, we kiss the cross, because on it the salvation of all humanity was accomplished. On the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, we want to honor the Cross and thank God for the great love of the Lord Jesus for us and for His death and resurrection. =



#### 15 of September - Our Lady of Sorrow - Memorial

The veneration of Our Lady of Sorrows is rooted in the Gospel from the first centuries of Christianity. From the fourth and fifth centuries there are descriptions and reflections on the life of Mary. In the West, many writers meditated and preached on the suffering of Our Lady.

Especially the saints, Ambrose, Anselm or Bernard. But the extraordinary development of this pious devotion dates from the thirteenth century. Mainly thanks to the preachers of the Franciscan and Servite orders. From this period comes, among others, the sequence "Stabat Mater". From the fourteenth century onwards, the motif of the seven sorrows of Mary often appeared. They are:

- 1. Simeon's prophecy (Lk 2:34-35)
- 2. The Flight into Egypt (Mt 2:13-14)
- 3. The Loss of Jesus (Lk 2:43-45)
- 4. The encounter with Jesus on the Way of the Cross 5. The crucifixion and death of Jesus (Mt 27:32-50; Mk 15, 20b-37; Lk 23: 26-46; Jn 19:17-30) 6. The Removal of Jesus from the Cross (Mk 15:42-47; Lk 23:50-54; Jn 19:38-42) 7. The entombment of Jesus (Mt 27:57-61; Mk 15: 42-47; Lk 23: 50-54; Jn 19:38-42)

Cardinal Wyszynski of Poland said: 'It is impossible to count how many swords pierced Mary's heart. Because her whole life was one great sword, one great suffering. To give birth to a Son so that he may die, and on the cross." Mary's presence on Calvary corresponds to God's plan, since on the day of the presentation of Jesus, Simeon, inspired by the Holy Spirit, spoke the prophetic words: "Your Son will be a sign of contradiction, and your soul will be pierced by a sword". The mystery of redemption began in Mary who, having known the Incarnation of Christ through the angel's annunciation, was incorporated into his Passion, Cross and Resurrection through a personal experience. That is why Mary, the Sorrowful Mother, can be called co-redemptrix and our mother, according to the testament of the dying Saviour, who said to the disciple, "Behold your mother," and to Mary, "Behold your son."

Mary, who welcomed every human being as her child in the person of John, is our model. A model of faith in situations of trial and suffering, a model of hope when all seems lost. Above all, she is a model of love that is not afraid of suffering, loneliness, sacrifice to the point of co-dying. Mary, grieving at the foot of the cross of her Son and our Lord, teaches us to be faithful to God to the end. Through her intercession, we too can unite our sufferings to the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross, offer them as reparation to God for the sins of the whole world and implore God's mercy.

The feast of Our Lady of Sorrows was popularized by St. Bernard of Clairvaux and the Cistercians, as well as the Servites. Pope Pius VII, after returning from Napoleonic captivity (1814), established it as obligatory for the whole Church, while Pius X ordered it to be celebrated on September 15.

Through the memory of Mary of Sorrows, we become aware of the sufferings of Our Lady who, like no other, was united to Christ, also in his passion, suffering and death.

#### Heating System at St. Francis De Sales Parish in High River

Last December 2022 and January of 2023, we experienced a major issue with our heating system. Some temporary repairs were done by the end of January 2023 to stop any further damage and to ensure that we have heat in our church building during winter time. But during that time it become evident that we need to look into our heating system.

After a long conversation with GM Mechanical, the company that has serviced our furnaces for many years, the conclusion was reached that all three units must be replaced due to their advanced age (30 years) & increasing unreliability. After reviewing quotes from a few firms, and after the approval of Parish and Financial Councils, GM Mechanical in High River was awarded the contract for following reasons:

- · They have satisfactorily serviced our system for years
- · They are local for rapid emergency response & indeed are our neighbours
- Their quote is considerably less (about \$60,000 or 25% lower) than the one of the Calgary firms.
- Approximately 14 20 weeks deliver to ensure that we have heat entering winter season.

The cost of the project is estimated to be \$173,670 + GST. however this cost could change based on unforeseen work requirements. Thanks to your generous support, we have a portion of the funds needed in our building and maintenance savings account, however we welcome any support from parishioners and supporters of St. Francis's Church.







#### Drawing Strength from Our Lady of Sorrows by Kimberly Hahn






