Sunday Readings

First Reading: (Isaiah 5: 1-7) Jesus picks up the story where Isaiah leaves off, even using Isaiah's words to describe the vineyard's wine press, hedge, and watchtower. Israel's religious leaders, the tenants in His parable, have learned nothing from Isaiah or Israel's past. Instead of producing good fruits, they've killed the owner's servants, the prophets sent to gather the harvest of faithful souls.

Second Reading: (Philippians 4:6-9) We need to take care that we don't let ourselves be overgrown with the thorns and briars of worldly anxiety. As today's Epistle advises, we need to fill our hearts and minds with noble intentions and virtuous deeds, rejoicing always that the Lord is near.

Gospel: (Matthew 21:33-43) In today's Gospel Jesus returns to the Old Testament symbol of the vineyard to teach about Israel, the Church, and the kingdom of God. And the symbolism of today's First Reading and Psalm is readily understood.

OCTOBER Month of the Holy Rosary

Saint John Paul II said "The Rosary is a treasure to be discovered," October is dedicated in a special way to praying the rosary. Rosary prayers are organized in churches, schools and at home. We say a prayer with beads, which is the most well-known and widespread form of Marian devotion in the world. Why October?

Well, on October 7, 1571, the fate of Christianity in Europe was decided. In the Battle of Lepanto, Christian troops defeated the Turkish army. Pope Pius V attributed this victory to the intervention of Our Lady invoked on the rosary recited during supplication processions through the streets of Rome. As a token of gratitude, he proclaimed this day the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. Two years earlier, he had introduced into the Litany of Loreto the invocation "Queen of the Holy Rosary – pray for us". Also in October (October 13, 1917) in Fatima, Our Lady appeared to the children with a rosary in her hand and said: "If you want to avoid the calamity that threatens the world, pray the rosary." This is how the services gathering crowds of believers for a common rosary prayer were created, and October itself became a permanent inscribed in the Catholic Church as the Marian month of the rosary.

Prayer of the Rosary

The Rosary is a prayer that is prayed in the Catholic Church especially in October. It is referred to as the prayer uniting Christians with the person of the Mother of Jesus and is one of the most popular prayers of the Church. Every Catholic knows it – poor and rich, child, adult and senior. It is a simple prayer, "the prayer of the sleeping, the dying, and the utterly tired". Through prayer we can entrust to Mary not only our joys and successes, but also all our sorrows and failures. The rhythmically repeated "Hail Mary" is a cry to Mary, Our Lady, asking for support. The mother will listen attentively to each one and then bring our petitions and supplications to God. Constant, persistent and patient prayer of the rosary works miracles. Therefore, let us not be afraid to reach for this effective prayer weapon for the intentions of the whole Church, all families, lonely people, lost in life and defenceless.

This month we especially want to undertake several initiatives that are to bring us closer to Mary through the prayer of the Rosary.

October 4, 2023 St. Francis of Assisi, Memorial

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ.

On the Memorial of St. Francis of Assisi, we begin a pathway of pastoral renewal in the Diocese of Calgary.

What is a pastoral renewal, and why did we decide to launch it on this day?

A pastoral renewal is an invitation to the Church of the Diocese of Calgary to renew and strengthen our commitment as individuals, parishes, and as a diocese to live the life that Christ calls us to in the midst of our world. We respond to His call through our baptism, our personal witness of the Faith and our desire to participate in the mission that Christ entrusted to the Church.

Our pastoral renewal is being launched on the Memorial of St. Francis of Assisi and it coincides with the opening of the First Session of the Synodal Assembly in Rome where I am currently present with Pope Francis, my brother bishops, and delegates from around the world. The life of our Diocese is united with the universal Church as witnessed through my participation at the Synod but also in our embarking on this pastoral renewal. It is in learning the synodal way of walking with others on the path of salvation, we encounter one another and experience together the presence of Christ in our midst and those whom He is calling us to serve.

While praying in the little church of St. Damian, St. Francis was drawn to the San Damiano cross and from there heard the voice of the Lord saying to him to repair His house which is falling apart. While mindful of the chapel that was in disrepair, St. Francis was much more aware of the call of Christ to lead the Church on a path of prayer, penance, and renewal. He did this by following Him more intently and in Joyful humility living his life and offering his work as a more authentic witness of Christ to all his brothers and sisters.

In a similar way, through this pastoral renewal, Catholics in the Diocese of Calgary are being called to intensify our following of Christ through three areas of pastoral priority that will help us as the Church to become more intentional in walking with the people. They are the fruit of our diocesan phase of the Synod and a year long process of further prayer, dialogue and discernment. In the coming years this pastoral renewal will call us:

- To be intentional in living our baptism and in the orientation of the parishes and the Diocese in being formed as missionary disciples of our Lord.
- To be a church of encounter and witness, to grow in our ability to listen to people's lived experiences, to be more present to one another through our shared faith and more authentic in our witness to Christ in word and deed.

Finally, to strengthen the human family in our own homes, in our parishes, in our schools, and in places where the Lord sends us so that we learn to accompany people at all stages of life.



This pastoral renewal, through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, will enable us to respond better to the call for a deeper conversion and experience the renewal that is needed in our world today.

As we embark on this path of renewal in the Diocese may we share in the zeal and passion of St. Francis in following Christ, and may we imitate all the saints who accepted their call to renewal within the Church by choosing the path of courage, fidelity and humility in being one with the Lord.
